

2021-2022 Hillcrest High School Visual Ensemble Information Packet

Information Meeting:

A general information meeting will be held for **ALL** students interested in auditioning for the Hillcrest High School Visual Ensemble on <u>Tuesday, February 9th at 5:30 p.m.</u> in the Hillcrest High School Theater. This meeting will allow the staff to provide you with information about the clinic, audition process, and expectations for the upcoming year. **Parents are expected to attend.**

***Please read all of the information in this packet. By committing to the audition process, you are also committing to being a part of the ensemble for the entirety of the marching season and performances during the post-season. All dates, requirements, and expectations are given well in advance for you to make an informed decision. If you are selected to be a part of the Visual Ensemble, you are expected to attend EVERY rehearsal and EVERY performance. Please be sure this activity is something you will be committed to before making this decision.

Audition Options:

Students may audition for one or more Visual Ensemble group: majorette, dance, and color guard. All candidates are **strongly encouraged** to audition for more than one group. If a student auditions for more than one group, she should indicate her order of preference on the *Hillcrest High School Visual Ensemble Application*.

Required Forms and Fees:

All candidates MUST submit the following forms prior to the audition clinics:

- Visual Ensemble Constitution/Demerit Agreement Form
- Hillcrest High School Visual Application (please attach a headshot to form)
- Completed Physical
- Clinic/Audition Fee (\$40)

All required forms and fees must be turned in to **Mr. Christian** no later than **Friday, March 5th.** All money should be turned in before first period begins. Checks should be made out to *Hillcrest High School*. YOU CANNOT PAY ONLINE! PAYMENTS MUST BE MADE TO MR. CHRISTIAN.

***Failure to turn in required forms and the clinic/audition fee by the deadline may result in ineligibility to audition and attend the scheduled clinics. All 2020-2021 band/visual fees must be paid in full in order or students to be eligible to attend clinic.

Audition Clinic:

Three mandatory clinics will be held before the audition in order to prepare students for the audition. The clinic days are <u>Tuesday, March 9th through Thursday, March 11th.</u> The clinics will be broken up by visual line, and you will be required to attend the clinic for any and all lines you are auditioning for. The clinic breakdown is as follows:

Dance: 4:00 – 5:00 pm (Tuesday – Thursday)
Guard: 5:00 – 6:00 pm (Tuesday – Thursday)
Majorette: 6:00 – 7:00 pm (Tuesday – Thursday)

The apparel for the clinic is comfortable practice clothes and jazz shoes or tennis shoes. Hair should be worn in a ponytail. All clinics will be held in the Hillcrest High School Gymnasium.

Parents are **not allowed** inside the gymnasium or multi-purpose room during the clinics.

Flag Check Out:

Anyone interested in auditioning for color guard may check out a flag through Mr. Christian prior to auditions. If you are a current 8th grader planning to audition, please email Mr. Christian (wrchristian@tcss.net) to arrange a time to pick one up.

Visual Audition Date/Time:

Auditions will be held on <u>Friday, March 12th, 2021</u> in the Hillcrest High School Gymnasium. Audition times are as follows:

Guard: 4:00 pm Dance: 5:00 pm Majorette: 6:00 pm

All times are approximate. Students need to arrive no later than 10 minutes before their audition time.

Parents are **not allowed** inside the gymnasium or multi-purpose room during the auditions.

Audition Procedures and Requirements:

Dance Audition Requirements:

- 1. Perform dance basics. (A list is provided later in this packet.)
- 2. Perform group routine. (Learned during clinic.)

Majorette Audition Requirements:

- 1. Perform baton/body basics. (A list is provided later in this packet.)
- 2. Perform group routine. (Learned during clinic.)

Color Guard Audition Requirements:

- 1. Perform flag/body basics. (A list is provided later in this packet.)
- 2. Perform group routine. (Learned during clinic.)

All students will report to the multi-purpose room at least 10 minutes prior to their audition time using the door at the back of Hillcrest High School. Students will randomly draw an audition number. Students will be briefed on details about the audition process upon arrival. The judging panel will consist of qualified individuals selected by the band directors. **Auditions are closed to the public**. Additionally, parents may not wait in the preparation room (multi-purpose room). Once the audition begins, students will not be allowed to leave the holding area for any reason until the audition is complete.

Audition Attire:

Dance/Majorettes: leotard, black shorts (optional), tights, jazz shoes, hair in a styled ponytail, and show make-up. Stud earrings will be allowed. No other jewelry.

Color Guard: leotard or fitted tank, black shorts, tights, jazz shoes, hair in a styled ponytail, and show make-up. Stud earrings will be allowed. No other jewelry.

Audition Results:

All results are final. Results will be posted on the Hillcrest High School Band website (https://www.hillcresthighschoolband.com/) by <u>Saturday, March 13th at 4:00 pm.</u>

Judges' comment sheets are available by request from the band director. Score sheets will not be available.

Section Leader/Captain Selections:

Leadership positions will be decided after members are selected. Selections will be made by the band directors and sponsor and will be based on ability, attitude, and leadership potential. Leadership candidates will participate in an interview with the directors and sponsor (more information will be provided later).

Financial Obligations:

New Members: \$1300

Returning Members: \$600 (plus any extra items needed)

Visual Fees cover 95% of the cost for the visuals, including uniforms, additional outfits, summer camp, equipment, field equipment, instruction, and supplies. A payment schedule is listed below:

April 7, 2021 - \$300 due **May 18, 2021** - \$300 due **June 29, 2021** - \$300 due

August 12, 2021 – remaining balance due

Visual Ensemble Meeting

The first Visual Ensemble Meeting after auditions will be held **Tuesday, April 6th at 5:30 pm**. The first Visual Ensemble payment of \$300 will be due at the April 6th Meeting.

Spring/Summer Obligations:

Visual Ensemble members will be required to attend ALL of the following commitments in the spring and summer (at Hillcrest High School) in order to remain an active member:

- 1. **Spring After School Obligations** Members will be required to attend all after school workouts after audition results are announced. The dates are listed below. Workouts will be held from 3:30 to 4:30 pm at Hillcrest High School.
 - a. April 20 & 27
 - b. **May 4, 11, & 18**
- 2. **Summer Workouts** Members will be required to attend scheduled workouts during the summer. All workouts will be held at Hillcrest High School.
 - a. June 15 & 29
 - b. **July 13**
- 3. **Band Camp** Members will be required to attend Band Camp, which will be held at Hillcrest High School.
 - a. **Tentative Dates: July 21 August 3** (excluding Saturdays and Sundays)
 - b. Leadership members will report earlier. Specific times will be given at a later date.

Fall After School Obligations:

Members will be required to attend ALL after-school practices during the fall marching season. A more detailed schedule will be given to members in May. Typical rehearsal schedules are **Monday**, **Tuesday**, and **Thursday** from **3:30** to **5:30** pm.

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Preparticipation Physical Evaluation

Rule 1, Sec. 14 — In order for a student to be eligible for interscholastic athletics, there must be on file in the Superintendent's or Principal's office a current physician's statement certifying that the student has passed a physical exam, and that in the opinion of the examining physician (M.D. or D.O.) the student is fully able to participate in interscholastic athletics (Grade s 7-12). The AHSAA Physicians Certificate (Form 5) must be used. A physical exam will satisfy the requirement for one calendar year through the end of the month from the date of the exam. For example, a physical given on May 5, 2015, will satisfy the requirement through May 31, 2016.

HILLCREST HIGH SCHOOL VISUALS CONSTITUTION

Purpose of the Group

To promote school spirit and provide visual appeal as part of the band by participating in half-time shows, pep rallies, and other performances.

- A. The "visuals," Dance line, Color Guard, and Majorette lines, will consist of a number decided on by the band director(s) and sponsor(s).
- B. The visuals are subject to all band rules, regulations, and policies, in addition to those mentioned herein.
- C. Cooperation among members is expected. Behavior inconsistent with that expectation will not be tolerated and can result in dismissal from the band. "Cooperating" is defined as having open communication with the band director(s) and sponsor(s), as well as respecting and following the leadership and decisions of the band director(s) and sponsor(s).

I. Audition Information

Students in the eighth, ninth, tenth, and eleventh grades are eligible to audition. Each auditioning individual must meet the following criteria:

- A. Be eligible according to TCSS and Hillcrest High School Guidelines.
- B. Be free of no *more* than two conduct violations and school suspensions for the current academic year in any class.
- C. Have <u>all</u> required permission forms and other paperwork signed and turned in to the appropriate person by the appropriate deadline.
- D. Have any and all outstanding visual and Band related debt paid in full from previous years.
- E. Have not been previously dismissed from the band for any disciplinary reason, unless the student has been approved to audition by both the band director(s) and the sponsor(s).
- F. Have not voluntarily quit the band at Hillcrest High School without prior consent of the band director(s) and sponsor(s) within the previous year. This includes but is not limited to being selected to the Visual Ensemble and "quitting" at any point after the audition process.
- G. Have a doctor's physical examination on file. Any condition/limitation not on the physical can result in permanent suspension from the band.

Other Audition Information

- A. A panel, consisting of the band director(s) and sponsor(s), will select and assemble judges for the selection of visual members.
- B. Upon the recommendation of the band director(s) and sponsor(s), a student may be allowed membership as a visual if said student is unable to participate in the audition process because of serious illness, injury, other medical issue, or by other just cause.

II. Visual Membership Requirements and Policies

Each visual member must meet the following requirements to remain a member of the band:

- A. Have school or family insurance.
- B. Have transportation to and from all activities and practices scheduled by the band director(s) and sponsor(s). *Transportation to and from out of town football games will be provided by school bus or commercial transportation.*
- C. Be in attendance and on time (preferably early) to all practices and activities.
- D. Attend scheduled workouts, visual, <u>and</u> band camps as scheduled by the band director(s) and sponsor(s). Any student that does not attend all camps can be dismissed from the band for the year.
- E. Maintain academic eligibility.
- F. Keep an emergency bag handy, to include the following items: tampons/pads, tights, lipstick, blush, and any other items necessary for emergencies. The sponsor(s) must approve additional items.
- G. The band director(s) and/or sponsor(s) have full rights to remove, cancel, or change any and all routines as necessary. This includes music selections.
- H. Alter or hem any uniform as requested by the band director(s) or sponsor(s) for any reason. Any expenses incurred are the responsibility of the individual.
- I. Adhere to the "Attendance Policies," and "Appearance Guidelines" as stated below.
- J. Abide by this Constitution, and all the terms stated within.

Other Visual Membership Requirements and Policies

- A. Payment notifications will be given to the student member during the Fall semester, but at least seven (7) days prior to the due date.
- B. Members may not invite or bring friends to practice unless approved by the band director(s) and the sponsor(s) in advance.
- C. Visual and full band activities such as eating out, cookouts, parties, etc. will be for members only unless otherwise notified by the band director(s) and/or sponsor(s).
- D. Fundraisers will be held throughout the year. Some fundraisers may be optional, however "Home Game Parking" is mandatory. Members are expected to participate in all mandatory fundraisers, whether visual specific or for full band.

III. Attendance Policies

- A. Members are required to be present at all practices and activities scheduled by the band director(s) and/or sponsor(s).
- B. If a member misses one practice for any unexcused reason in any week, they will not be allowed to perform that week without band director(s) and sponsor(s) approval. The band director(s) and sponsor(s) have full and exclusive rights to determine what reasons constitute excused or unexcused on a case by case basis.
- C. Routine doctor's appointments should be made for non-practice days. To be excused from any practice, the band director(s) and/or sponsor(s) must be informed in advance, and may require a doctor's excuse as proof.

IV. Appearance Guidelines

- A. During scheduled performances and other events and activities, members must be aware of their appearance at all times by following these guidelines:
 - 1.Clean uniform/equipment
 - 2. No visible, unapproved, unnatural colors added to hair
 - 3.No jewelry (unless part of uniform as determined by the band director(s) and sponsor(s))
 - 4.No colored nail polish
 - 5. No runs in stockings (an extra pair needs to be carried to each event)
 - 6. Wearing performance make-up
- B. The band director(s) and sponsor(s) must approve all attire. This includes t-shirts, pants, skirts, shoes, pull-overs, etc. (Anything worn in the name of the band)
- C. Uniforms will only be worn for school functions.
- D. While in uniform (and even when they are not), members should be aware that they are representing their families, community, school, band, band director(s), and sponsor(s). Behavior should be consistent with that of the Tuscaloosa County Board code of conduct.
- E. Underarms and legs must be shaved.

V. Suspension from the band

- A. Repeated violation of school rules will result in permanent suspension from the hand
- B. Any student receiving more than three discipline referrals to the office in the preceding year will not be allowed to audition for any line.
- C. Permanent suspension prevents the member from auditioning for the band in the future.

VI. Rights of the Band Director(s) and Sponsor(s)

A. The band director(s) and sponsor(s) may make exceptions to the provisions of this constitution if at any time he/she/they feel(s) it is in the best interest of the student or band.

A Visual Ensemble <u>candidate</u> will be eliminated from the audition process if she accumulates 30 demerits after review of the current school year's discipline record. A Visual Ensemble <u>member</u> will be suspended for one full game performance is she accumulates **30 demerits**. If the member accumulates **15** additional demerits, **for a total of 45**, she will be dismissed from the Visual Ensemble and will be unable to audition for the following year.

If a student is dismissed from the Visual Ensemble/Band Program, refunds of fees will not be given.
